Making a Splash

n-term swimming classes have concluded for 2017. Held at the HBF Arena, these classes are provided by the Department of Education as part of the Health and Physical Education learning area. The qualified teachers follow best practice in assisting students to learn essential skills in swimming and water safety through the Department's Swimming and Water Safety Continuum. Some of the Royal Life Saving Society's personal survival skills are also offered to those who completed the lower levels. Our students have enjoyed the 10 sessions and they have successfully achieved levels commensurate with their ability.



Talk4Writing

We are always looking for ways to maximise our students' achievement across all learning areas, with particular attention to Literacy and Numeracy. Using the guidance provided in the school's business plan, we have progressively begun implementing a powerful whole-school literacy strategy called Talk4Writing. Based on the principles of how children learn, Talk4Writing is powerful because it enables children to imitate the language they need for a particular topic orally before reading and analysing it and then writing their own version. Teachers have participated in workshops and school visits in order to understand how to add Talk4Writing into their daily literacy block. From 2018 when this is fully implemented in all year levels, the benefits to students literacy levels will become evident. From the Principal

Another busy couple of weeks have flown by since the last newsletter. Here is a snapshot of what we have been up to:

School Development Day

Last Friday 19 May staff came together to reflect on health and wellbeing for students and staff. The morning was dedicated to student wellbeing with staff reflecting on the vision and learning environment we want for our students. Our school psychologist, Kristy Mollett, presented a snapshot of Smiling Minds, an evidence-based mindfulness programme, to staff, followed up with discussions about our expectations for implementation in Weeks 7-10 of this term and Weeks 1 & 2 in Term 3.

Smiling Minds aims to build happier, healthier and more compassionate people. The programme is designed to support students in dealing with daily life.

Coupled with the Smiling Minds initiative, staff were exposed to KidsMatter and our desire to integrate it into our daily pedagogy. KidsMatter is a mental health and wellbeing framework for primary schools and is proven to make a positive difference to the lives of Australian children.

Brain Ambulance

The afternoon was dedicated to the wellbeing of staff and we were captivated by Deb from the Brain Ambulance. We were given an insight into mental health, its problems and the impact it has on our lives. This was a follow-up from a previous School Development Day session held last year.

Staff Meeting

At the staff meeting we undertook Professional Learning on how to give positive feedback to other colleagues to improve their performance in the classroom and as a result the teaching staff will complete a triad before Week 3 Term 3 putting into practice the principles taught.

In-term Swimming Lessons

Students have participated in their annual in-term swimming lessons and things are going smoothly once we ironed out the bugs. Even though it has been chilly, we hope that all have enjoyed the change in pace, and the experience.

(The Book Review Competition runs weekly so get your entries in!)





SCHOOL PHOTO DAY IS COMING

Our school photo day is **Thursday July 20** in Week 1 Term 3. Approximately two weeks prior to the photo day every student will receive a Kapture Photography order envelope to bring home.
