



CONSENT FORMS

Edgewater Primary School aims to offer your child the widest range of learning opportunities and celebrate their learning whenever possible. This may often require some form of parental consent. This form asks you to consent (or otherwise) to your child's participation / use / access to several aspects of the school program. At all times we make the very best efforts to exercise exemplary standards in respect of duty of care.

MEDIA CONSENT

Children's images and/or their work are often published to recognise excellence or effort and may appear in newspapers, on the Internet, in newsletters or on video. Their first name only may also be included but no contact details are provided. Work/images captured by the school will be kept for no longer than is necessary for the purposes outlined above and will be stored and disposed of securely.

- Yes, I give consent to my child to have his/her image and/or work published as described above.
- No, I do not give consent.

INTERNET ACCESS

Student access to the Internet is provided by the DOE in accordance with the school policy (available from the office or school website). Student access is contingent on abiding by the users' Code of Conduct.

- Yes, my child has permission to access the Internet in accordance with school policy.
- No, I do not give consent.

VIEWING CONSENT

To support student learning, from time to time, teachers may stream videos, movies or documentaries as part of their learning. Almost always these are 'G' rated and don't require consent. Very occasionally something with a 'PG' rating is appropriate for which we would need parental permission.

- Yes, I consent to my child viewing items with a 'PG' rating if deemed suitable by the teacher and school administration.
- No, I do not give consent.

ACCEPTABLE USAGE AGREEMENT (INTERNET)

My child agrees to follow the rules set out in the Acceptable Usage Agreements on the reverse when using the computers and the Internet at school. If they use the Internet or the computers in a way that they shouldn't, then they may not be able to use them for a period of time. I have discussed this with my child and they understand what they must do and how they must behave when they are using the school computers.

If signed, this Acceptable Use Agreement will remain effective until such times as you advise the school otherwise.

ACCEPTABLE USAGE AGREEMENT FOR PRIMARY STUDENTS K-3

My child agrees to follow the rules set out below when they use the computers and the Internet at school.

They will:

- Not use a school computer unless the teacher tells them to.
- Tell the teacher straight away if they see anything on the screen that makes them feel uncomfortable or not OK.
- Not give out their name, mum or dad's name or phone number, their address, the name of our school, photos of them or other details about themselves or other people unless the teacher says it is OK.
- Not be silly when using a computer.
- Not use the school computers to be mean, unkind or hurtful to other people.

They know that:

- If they are silly or damage a computer they may not be able to use it for a period of time.

My child knows that if they break any of the rules in the agreement, they will be spoken to by the teacher or Associate Principal, and they may not be able to use the school computers for a period of time.

ACCEPTABLE USAGE AGREEMENT FOR PRIMARY STUDENTS YEARS 4-6

My child agrees to follow the rules set out below when they use the computers and the Internet at school.

They will:

- Not use the school computers unless the teacher knows, or has asked them to.
- Not give their password out to others.
- Not let other people sign on to their account without checking with the teacher first.
- Press the back button and immediately tell the teacher if they see anything on the screen that makes them feel uncomfortable or they know is not OK.
- Only use work from the Internet if they have asked the teacher.
- Not give out their name, parent's names and phone numbers, their address, name of their school, photos or other details about themselves without checking with the teacher first.
- Take care when using the computer equipment and will not change the computer settings.
- Not use the school computers to be mean, rude or unkind to other people.

They know that:

- If they use the Internet or computers in ways that they shouldn't, then they may not be able to use them for a period of time.

My child knows that if they break any of the rules in the agreement, they will be spoken to by the teacher or Associate Principal, and they may not be able to use the school computers for a period of time.
