Edgewater Primary School opened in 1983 and has grown into a well-resourced educational facility. The school is surrounded by native trees and vegetation with ample play areas.

Student enrolments range between 410 - 430. Within the school there is strong collaborative support between the School Board, an active Parents and Citizen's Association, school staff, the parent body and the broader community. Many families have retained ongoing links with second generation returning to the school.

This plan details our four strategic priorities intended to have maximum impact on overall school performance in both academic and non-academic areas. The school is looking to the future to ensure that our young people thrive in a time of rapid social and technological change - Alice Springs (Mparntwe) Declaration.


Our Business Plan has been developed collaboratively by our community; school leaders, the School Board, staff, students and parents. It is underpinned by four strategic priorities:


