# From the Principal

The joy of the role of Principal is that one has the opportunity to engage with all students, K-6. Last week I participated in the first student councillor meeting. Aiva's skills as chairperson of the meeting were impressive. At all times she encouraged and respected the views of all members of the student council.

The knowledge, experience and talents of the parent body add value to the school community. My perception is that Edgewater has a strong affiliation with their community. Gabrielle Grime in her professional capacity as education officer at the Wanneroo Museum used her expertise to provide professional learning for staff of practical ways to engage our students in local Aboriginal history as required in the HASS curriculum.

Emily Hamilton MLA Joondalup visited the school as a welcome gesture and to offer support for the schools expression of interest for the science laboratory and resource grant for 2020/21.

The school currently has 45 kindergarten children enrolled for 2019. We would like to increase enrolments to 60 to be able to run three classes. There may still be families that are still to enrol. Please assist by spreading the word that Edgewater has places (in and out of area) available for 2019.

Students continue to enjoy the nature playground at the back of the oval and as a community we are making the necessary adjustment that comes with change. The school took the opportunity to clarify some concerns with the Department of Education around use and liability etc.

As we are not a gated school we rely on Edgewater's resident community to respect the grounds and in essence protect the buildings and grounds for the use of the children 'as a school'.

Duty of care for children is handed to parents at the siren at the end of the school day. Also please note that school toilets are locked at 3.20pm each day. This allows 20 mins for children to use the toilets as they leave the school site.

On Monday 13 August access to the biannual **National School Opinion Survey** will be sent via School Star and SMS. This mandated survey is open until **Friday 24 August**. The survey can be viewed as a means of collecting perceptual data from the parent community to guide future planning or as a celebration of the great the school that Edgewater Primary School strives to be.

# Chaplain



# **ThinkUKnow**

Edgewater Primary School will be hosting a ThinkUKnow presentation on Wednesday 5 September at 6.30pm and all parents, carers and teachers are encouraged to attend.

ThinkUKnow Australia is a cyber safety education program that educates parents, carers and teachers of how people are using technology, the challenges they may face online, and how to help them overcome these in a safe and ethical way.

ThinkUKnow Australia is a partnership between the Australian Federal Police, Microsoft Australia, Datacom and the Commonwealth Bank. The program is delivered in collaboration with policing partners New South Wales Police Force, Northern Territory Police, Queensland Police, South Australia Police, Tasmania Police, Western Australia Police, as well as Neighbourhood Watch Australasia.

The presentation will be delivered by a local law enforcement member and an industry volunteer. The presentation

covers issues relating to children and young peoples' privacy and security online, their relationships with other users and their online reputation. It provides insight into the devices young people are using, as well as the popular websites, apps and social networking sites they're accessing.

This is a fantastic opportunity for you to learn more about young people and the online environment, and how you can help them to be safe and responsible users of technology.

Literacy Planet's Word Mania is back and students in Room 8 have been racing against the clock to build as many words as they can in three minutes.


They are required to drag letters into the word board to make words, then click the "Mark" button, swaping letters to build more words as quickly as possible.

Keep up the good work Room 8.




### **Book Week**
