Over the past few weeks we have held several parent information sessions. I have been delighted with the turnout of parents on both occasions and trust that those who attended have gained valuable insights. We will continue to seek more opportunities to engage with our parents about a range of topics, building strong partnerships to support our students' learning and development. **NAPLAN Online**

We are still waiting on 2017 NAPLAN Student Reports to be delivered to the school but believe they will be here very soon. From 2018 schools across Australia will start to conduct NAPLAN assessments online. Our school has been selected as one of those to start in 2018. In preparation for this we will be taking the opportunity to assess our readiness to move to this new format during Week 6 of this term. Students in Year 3 and 5 will participate in a school readiness test (SRT) throughout the week designed to ensure that our computer network infrastructure is capable of handling the demands of the testing regime. NAPLAN Online will allow for a wider range of question types and a broader range of skills to be assessed. It will also feature tailored testing, where the test automatically responds to student performance, providing more, or less, demanding questions based on how a student has gone in previous sections. This means that NAPLAN Online will provide more precise results and a more engaging test experience for students.

One Big Voice

Australia's largest children's choir is once again performing at the Perth Arena next Friday 18 August. Our senior choir will join other choirs from the northern suburbs of Perth to sing positive, life affirming songs as a collective voice. This is really something to hear and celebrate. A special thank you to Mr Hadzic, Mrs Bock and Mr Grey who will be accompanying the students to the rehearsal and then the evening performance. It's a long day, but something the students really enjoy and remember well after the event.
