In this newsletter I would like to highlight and celebrate our student's academic success as measured using standardized assessments such as NAPLAN conducted in Year 3 & 5, and PAT (Progressive Assessment Test) conducted in Years 3 -6.

This year is the first year that Year 3 has joined Year 4-6 and achieved above the Australian Norm.




#### EPS Year 3 NAPLAN Comparative Performance (compares current cohort to past cohorts)
