From the Principal

The first three weeks of the school year has been very busy with students settling into new year levels and new families settling into or returning to the neighbourhood.

On Wednesday of Week 2, the school hosted two Principals, Rebecca Bope working as a Director in the School Accountability Directorate, and Blake Ingersole, from Sutherland Primary, as they guided the school through validation of our selfassessment for public assurance, called a Public School Review. I sincerely thank all staff and school board members for the six months of preparation for the review. The school was validated with a three-year return review period in all six standards. The standards being: Relationships and Partnerships, Teaching Quality, Learning Environment, Use of Resources, Leadership and Student Achievement and Progress. The report will be available later in the term.

Edu Dance is well under way and our Year 6 cohort have completed one week of Interm swimming, this year at the beach. On Friday we announced the Year 6 Executive Student Councillors and Faction Captains, along with Semester 1 Year 4 and 5 Student Councillors. All student can be proud of their speeches last Friday. It is a joy to be an observer as the children grow and mature into responsible, caring and capable community members. Opportunities to take on a leadership position is available in Semester 2 for Year 4 and 5 students and Year 6 Harmony and Sustainability leaders are still to be selected.

Welcome back to the 2023 school year. It's been lovely seeing all the old faces and some new ones across the canteen counter over the last couple of weeks. I think everyone has had a growth spurt! The children all seem to have got taller over the Christmas holidays.

If you're new to the EPS family, we (Kerry van Drunick and Vanessa Browne - co-managers) would like to introduce ourselves. We run the school canteen, which is open 5 days a week from 8am to 1.45pm for meal orders and over the counter sales at recess and lunch.

All lunch orders are to be made online via the online ordering system, <u>Quickcliq.com.</u> Please visit the site prior to ordering for



the first time to register and set up an account for your child. The cut-off time for orders is 9am on the day the meal is required, however, orders can be placed up to 4 weeks in advance. Cash is accepted for students wishing to purchase over the counter items at recess and lunch time.

We are proud to run a (mostly) healthy school canteen. All our tray meals are homemade and prepared in the canteen using fresh and nutritious ingredients. Hidden vegetables are our catch phrase! We use wholemeal bread, wraps and rolls and bake low sugar and low fat pizza, muffins and cookies. Check out our menu on the <u>EPS website</u> or on <u>Quickcliq.</u>
