Beiridge Secondary College has built a reputation for excellence with its academic and sporting programs. The Elite Netboll Academy was established in 2013 and in 2021 was endorsed as a Netboll WA Tier 2 Specialist School.

The Eite Netball Academy is timetabled for 4 periods per week with a focus on the development of skill, tactics and strategies in the game, fitness requirements and teamwork. Over the course duration, students will also develop their knowledge and skills in the areas of coaching, umpiring, nutrition, first aid and sport psychology.

Throughout the year the Netball Academy's main competition is the School Sport WA - High School Cup Netball Competition. Here students compete against a number of different schools and make progress further into the competition with each game they win. We also compete in Lightning Camivals and various friendly scratch matches over the year, finishing up with our final tournament the Belridge Cup'. This is our intra-school competition with all the teams throughout the Belridge Netball Academy from Year 7 - 12 competing against each other.

Students in Year 11 and 12 will be given the opportunity to travel overseas on an international tour (subject to travel directives). They will experience both the Netball competition within another country, as well as the different lifestyle and cultures. Students will come away from the tour gaining lifelong memories and friendships that they have made along the way.
