# Do you have the school App on your smartphone?

It is called **Updat-ed** and can be downloaded from the Play Store (Android) or the App Store (iPhone). Instructions on the school home page.

### **Online Student Banking**

Parents can now open a school banking account for their children using an online option. Log on to www.commbank.com.au/schoolbanking and follow the instructions.

When a parent/carer opens an account online, they will be sent a pack in the mail. This should take 6-10 working days to arrive. This pack contains a yellow wallet and deposit book, terms & conditions and a voucher for your child to collect a Platy Money Box from their local branch.

If a parent or child's identification is not accepted through the online application, they will be directed to visit their local branch to provide these details. Without the identification process being completed, the child **CAN** still commence School Banking and will still receive their deposit book. They just won't be able to withdraw from the account until both the child and parent have been identified. When the books arrive, parents need to write the account details onto the deposit book. If you have any problems please contact the help desk on **1800 674 496**.



The online account opening process at this stage is only for children under 14 years of age and can only be opened by the child's parent or legal guardian.

Grandparents can only use the online account opening process if they are their grandchild's legal guardian. If they aren't please refer them to their local branch to review their options.

The school is no longer able to hand out or accept paper based applications.

## **School Carpark Safety**

School carparks are strictly for the use of staff and authorised visitors to the school. All parents/carers should use the street parking bays provided on Treetop Avenue or Kestrel Mews.

Students are not permitted to use school carparks on their way to or from school. Some parents/carers have been walking through the carparks to access the oval for the Target 200+ Running Club and for taking students to early childhood classrooms. Access to these areas should only be by footpaths provided to the school buildings to ensure the safety for all.
