

NAPLAN Online

As mentioned in the Week 3 newsletter, Year 3 and 5 students from Edgewater Primary School will be participating in NAPLAN Online. The dates for NAPLAN testing are from Tuesday 10 May to Friday 20 May (Weeks 3 and 4 of Term 2).

On Thursday 24 March, students in Rooms 8 and 17 participated in the national co-ordinated practice test. Students from all Year 3 and 5 classes have the opportunity to engage in practice tests before the end of term in preparation for the assessments.

Students are also able to familiarise themselves with the NAPLAN Online testing environment by accessing the ACARA NAPLAN Online public demonstration site at <u>https://www.nap.edu.au/</u> <u>online-assessment/public-demonstration-site</u>.
