# **Using Play Equipment After School**

# **Buckingham House**

On Tuesday 20 March the students from R12 along with five parent helpers, enjoyed a fantastic morning at Buckingham House learning about the early settlers in this area. Buckingham House was built in the 1880s and was a family home until the early 1970s when the Shire of Wanneroo took ownership and turned it into a museum.

The students were taken back to a much simpler time and they participated in a variety of activities including making butter and damper, sewing, hand washing clothes, milking a model cow and taking a lesson in the old classroom.

The volunteers at Buckingham House shared a lot of historical information which was relevant to our Humanities and Social Science studies and they

made the learning fun and interesting. It was also pleasing to receive positive comments about the lovely behaviour of our students as they moved through the house.

We are very lucky to have such an interesting piece of history right on our doorstep.




