


We were entertained with much dancing and singing when Mrs Rubidge's Year 3 class hosted the assembly on Friday 7 June.

Buckingham House

Over weeks 8-9, all three Y3 classes had the opportunity to experience some ways of life of early settlers in our local area by visiting Buckingham House in Wanneroo. Buckingham House was built in the 1800s and was a family home until the early 1970's when the Shire of Wanneroo took ownership and turned it into a museum.

Rooms 11, 14 and 17 became familiar with tasks that required a lot more work and time, such as hand-washing clothes and making butter and damper in small, wood-fired ovens. They practised sewing, learnt about cramped bedrooms and even got to have a lesson in a class as it would have been in the 1800's. Some students were introduced to the idea of the cane!

Our excursion would not have been possible without the help of the Buckingham House volunteers and our very own parent volunteers who gave their time to lead groups through activities. Volunteers at Buckingham House gave very interesting and detailed recounts of the history of our local area which we are learning about in the Y3 Humanities and Social Science Learning Area.

We are so lucky to still be able to experience our past through preserved local landmarks.

Online Safety

Talking about online safety is very important to help your children safely navigate the digital world and educate them to help protect them from potential dangers. Supporting and guiding your children can help give them confidence in making sound decisions online and learn that they can ask for help when they need it.

Being engaged, open and supportive can help you and your children learn about safety together. Some of the steps you can take involve sharing online time with them during family time and playing games together. Keeping communication open and asking your children about their online experience can also help build a supportive environment.

Setting rules about devices and online access can also help keep your children safe and help them to understand the consequences for breaking these rules. Allowing your children to have input in these rules can also help them understand the importance of the rules. The rules can be in a form of a family tech agreement that everyone helps to create and follows together.

Getting to know the devices that your children use and helping them set up their privacy and online safety is another good strategy to help keep you and your family eSafe.

Second Hand Uniform Stall

A reminder that the second-hand uniform stall is located in the courtyard next to the staff room, near the bike racks. Donations can be dropped off in the tubs under the racks. While we gratefully accept all donations, please be mindful that items should be clean and in a condition to be worn (no rips, large stains, etc.).

The stall works on an honour system and a gold coin donation is requested should you take anything. Money can be placed in the tin mounted on the wall, proceeds go towards P&C fundraising. There is currently a large number of pants and shorts in the stall and it is always worth checking for shirts as well!

Kiss and Ride

Please be mindful of the following guidance for use of the Kiss and Ride on Treetop Avenue in order to keep traffic flowing and create a safe environment for all.

- If the Kiss and Ride is full, do not queue on Treetop Avenue as this creates a traffic jam for other drivers.
- Instead use the roundabouts to do a loop and come back around.
 Time your arrival so that school has ended and your children have had a chance to make their way to the Kiss and Ride area. Kiss and Ride spaces are not parking bays at any time of the day.
- Children should only ever enter the car when you are stopped in one of the Kiss and Ride bays or you have parked elsewhere. Do not allow children to enter your car when you are in the road.

Canteen News

We've had a couple of requests from parents to extend the cut-off time for lunch orders from 9.00am to 9.30am or 10.00am.

We certainly understand how difficult the morning rush is sometimes. Waking children up, getting them to eat breakfast, getting them dressed, making sure teeth are brushed and hair combed, finishing off homework, packing their backpacks and then getting them to school on time and still remembering to get a lunch order in before 9.00 am.

Unfortunately, due to new food regulations usually there is one canteen person on duty each day and it's normally very busy, bearing in mind that we make fresh pizzas and cookies every day and then do a batch of tray meals.

In addition, we regularly cleanse and sanitise the benches, prep salads, check the temperatures of fridges, freezers and ovens, put in orders with suppliers, etc. We find that printing off the day's orders early so that we can get them collated and the lunches prepared makes the day run more smoothly.

We appreciate that this is not convenient for all parents and thank you for your understanding; however, the good news is that **lunch orders can be placed any time up to four weeks in advance** before the day it is required.

We've also had a few enquiries recently as to what **gluten free** items we have on offer. We are pleased to advise that we provide the following gluten free meals and snacks:

Meals - Butter chicken, pasta bolognaise and salad bowls; **Pastries** - chunky beef pie and bacon and cheese quiche; **Recess snacks** - chocolate muffins, popcorn, cheese and crackers, boiled eggs, fresh fruit cups/slices, 1/2 corn cob and cheese sticks; **Ice creams** - vanilla tubs, icy poles and mini Calippos.

SCHOOL PHOTO DAY IS COMING!

Our school photo day is coming in Term 3! Every student will receive a personalised flyer to bring home from Kapture Photography containing your child's unique codes for ordering school photos online.

KEEP YOUR FLYER SECURE!

The unique codes contained on the flyer will be issued only once.

Order **EARLY** for sibling photography

Sibling photos can ONLY be ordered online. Once you receive the personalised flyers for your children, it is imperative that you order your sibling photo early to avoid missing out! There is a physical limit in the school schedule to how many sibling photos can be taken. Once the maximum capacity of sibling orders has been reached, no more sibling orders can be placed.

If maximum capacity is not reached, sibling orders **close 12pm midday sharp**, <u>one business day prior</u> to the first photo day.

The school or the photographers <u>cannot</u> accept late orders for sibling photography. Please do not ask as your request simply cannot be accommodated.

Order **EARLY** for discount photo day prices

Order your photos up to 10 calendar days after photo day to receive discount photo day prices. Late orders are handled separately to the school delivery and incur a \$30 custom service charge.

Other information

Kapture offer a money back guarantee for any parent who is not fully satisfied with their photo package. Should you have any queries before or after photo day, please check the FAQ's on the Kapture website.

We request that students who are displaying signs of respiratory and / or gastrointestinal illnesses do not attend school specifically to be included in their class photo. Having students with communicable illnesses attend the photography venues puts other students, school staff and Kapture staff at risk – especially those that are already immunocompromised.

Students who are unable to attend school photo day can book a studio appointment at our Malaga office to be photographed during school holidays. We appreciate your understanding in this matter.

Your school will notify you in a few weeks when **team and special group photos** are available to view and purchase on the Kapture website. Please note; class, individual and sibling portraits are not available to view online prior to purchase.

All students will be photographed individually on photo day for school administration records AS WELL as included in their class group presentation available for purchase to all families. Should there be any reason why your child should **NOT** be included in the photo shoot –please contact the school office.
