From the Principal

With the arrival of winter comes the wonder of rainbows. I hope you have been amazed by their duplicity, range and vibrancy of colours. We have been fortunate to have also had much needed rain. The school's wet weather policy is designed to keep the children indoors at times of heavy rainfall, yet flexible enough to allow movement on showery days.

On the school development day last Friday, staff worked through critical incident management planning and future directions with our ICT learnings that were fast tracked during distance education preparation.

As of Monday 8 June, parents will be welcomed back on site to escort children to classroom doors and carry out school business. A maximum of 100 parents/visitors is allowed.

Over the last month the unexpected benefits of Year 1-6 students entering the school site from the gates around the school have been:

- -a noticeable improvement in student independence and confidence
- -a quieter learning environment
- -lessons beginning on time
- -teacher focus on students as they enter classrooms; and
- -our emerging teenagers having space to engage and settle before classes begin

Parents who attended the P&C on Monday 18 May all agreed that encouraging this independence and confidence in students should continue. Students will continue to be met at the school gates in the morning by a member of admin, whilst a second member of admin continues to circulate around the school grounds. Please continue to communicate with teaching staff via email to arrange meetings or raise any questions or concerns.

As a school we will remain cautious and we ask that Kindergarten 2 and Pre-Primary parents continue to drop off and collect children at the classroom doors on the opposite side of the playground when the gates are opened at 8.30am by Pre-primary staff.

School Assemblies will continue to be conducted by student councillors over the PA system for the rest of Term 2.

At this stage, we will be running the cross country with no parental spectators. We plan to video the end of each race. Save the date – Wednesday 24 June – in the event that restrictions ease/change.

Health Considerations

Thank you parents for your continued precautions with your child/ren's health by staying home if unwell. As we officially head into winter, be reassured that our school has followed the Department of Education's prescribed infection control processes and infection site readiness preparations. Be mindful that members of our whole school community have been and will continue partaking in precautionary COVID-19 testing.

The school has provided staff the opportunity to have an influenza shot. We encourage all parents to take up the current opportunity for primary school children to have influenza shots free of charge through your GP.

Semester 1 Reports

Please note teaching staff have been allocated extra time for report preparation and writing. Student reports are planned to be released by Thursday 2 July. This semester, there is no requirement for teaching staff to allocate grades. The interface of student reports has been adjusted by the Department to reflect this change for Semester 1 reporting.


National Simultaneous Storytime

Looking for work or a career change? Can you see yourself working in a school? Need help to find work in the coronavirus craziness?

Schools and other organisations are regularly hiring people for the following roles:

• Gardener, cleaner, administration, management, canteen, education assistants and many other roles.

Starting in July 2020, North Metropolitan TAFE are running a one-semester course on the skills required to be a successful candidate for employment in a school or elsewhere. The course aids in preparation for entry into gardening, cleaning, administration, management, canteen and education assistant work.

We have had huge success supporting people to find work and the chances of gaining employment are strong. This course is suitable for existing gardeners, cleaners, administrators etc., and people looking to change career or people looking for a return to work.

The course includes:

- Training in skills specific to the role you are interested in e.g. IT skills
- Work experience in a school or other organisation
- Help and support to find work
- Help accessing further training as required e.g. Certificate III in Education Support
- Development of your job application cover letter, resume and help with selection criteria

- Strong work ethic
- Good oral and written communication

Does Your Child Need Help in Mathematics?

Our final year Education students studying in the Primary programme and working under the guidance of mathematics education staff will be conducting support sessions for children experiencing difficulty in mathematics. These Education students are Mathematics Education specialists so they should be able to support your child very effectively.

We are offering <u>free</u> places to children in Years 4 to 6, who attend schools where teachers mentor preservice teaching students from Edith Cowan University. The support would involve four one-hour mathematics assistance sessions. Due to the COVID-19 situation we are limiting this clinic to 18 children and we will ensure that appropriate measures are taken.

When: The program involves an initial test of approximately one hour and four subsequent one-hour weekly sessions. This would require a sincere commitment to ensure that children attend all four one-hour sessions. The session dates and times are listed below:
