Laila has been chosen as the Year 4 Aussie of the Month as she displays all the qualities that make her an excellent student.

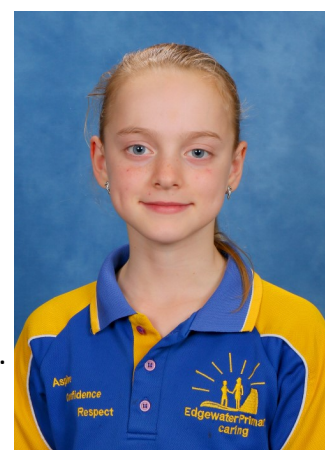
