Academic Celebration! We recently received NAPLAN comparative data for our Year 3 and 5 students. Following a whole school improvement focus on the English learning area, we are pleased to share that our Year 3 students were above the national average score and LIKE SCHOOLS in all five areas assessed. In reading and writing, the Year 3 cohort achieved in the above expected range predicted for the school. Our Year 5 students were above the national average score, and above Like Schools in reading and writing. Well done to the collective effort of all staff and the Year 3 and 5 students.

As our native plants flower around the school, we acknowledge the hard work of our wonderful school gardener, **Mr Deering**, and thank him for the preparation of the grounds for the athletics carnivals.





### **Chaplain's Chat**

#### Helping children learn positive friendship skills

Friendships are an important part of life and help children to learn social skills that will benefit them their whole life. It also helps children to have higher self-confidence and perform better academically. Friendships can change over the years, especially among primary school children, due to their skills and interests changing. It is important to help your children build their positive friendship skills so they can continue to have effective relationships with their peers.

Children who are good at making friends often have positive social skills. It is important for parents and caregivers to help guide their children in developing positive social skills by providing them with Examples, and by providing opportunities for children to practise through playdates and other social activities. Key social skills that help build healthy friendships are cooperation, communication, empathy, emotional control, and taking responsibility.

Many children go through conflicts in their friendships especially as they grow older. Having positive social skills allow children to navigate these conflicts without jeopardising their friendships, and provides them with the opportunity to grow their relationships and making them stronger.
