From the Principal

My, how time flies when you are having fun! It's newsletter time again.

This past week has seen swimming over for another year, WA Day come and go, teachers participating in the Talk 4 Writing professional learning, the launching of the new look Nature Play area and a very successful Pirate Day Friday fundraiser.

Professional Learning

This semester, staff have engaged in some significant professional learning. Early years teachers and Education Assistants participated in Letters and Sounds professional learning. Letters and Sounds is a synthetic phonics program the school has adopted across Kindergarten to Year 2. It is designed to help educators teach children how the alphabet works for reading and spelling by:

- Fostering children's speaking and listening skills which are valuable in their own right and as preparation to learning phonic knowledge and skills
- Teaching high quality phonics work at the point teachers judge children should begin

Most staff have also undertaken Talk 4 Writing professional learning.

This program develops good writing practice by commencing with expanding oral language skills. It has been adopted by many schools with great success and we expect to improve our writing results as this whole-school programme is fully implemented in 2018. Both these initiatives are part of our action plan for English and designed to improve students' literacy skills.

Pirate Day Friday

Edgewater was invaded by pirates on Thursday in the Kindy and the whole school on Friday. Everyone had the option of dressing up as a pirate and placing some gold in the treasure chest. We, me hearties, raised \$488 for Children's Cancer Research. Thank you to everyone who participated and donated to this worthy cause. A fun day was had by all!

Many of our students ride bikes to school and it is important for their safety that their bikes are regularly checked to ensure that the brakes are fully functional and the tyres are pumped up. It is a requirement that students riding bikes wear a helmet and ride carefully on dual use paths. It is recommended that students under Year 4 do not ride to school as their perception distance and speed is not well-developed.

Pastoral Care

Have you seen our new 'Buddy Bench'?

Sometimes students are left feeling isolated and lonely as they navigate the complexities of relationships and play at school. As part of our Pastoral Care Programme and to help create a more inclusive playground, Edgewater Primary School has installed a Buddy Bench.

The Buddy Bench, located outside the library, is a simple idea to eliminate loneliness and foster friendship in the playground. When a student feels the need for a friend to talk to, they can show this by using the Buddy Bench. Other students and staff will recognise this as a sign that some help, support or comfort is needed and will come to talk with the them. The Buddy Bench is a means by which students can seek support without



the need to rationalise their feelings or to seek-out a particular member of staff or special friend. Because the bench is in the day-to-day environment of the school, it can be used at any time and for any reason—from seemingly trivial matters to more serious concerns—and it encourages students to ask for help when they feel troubled.





