
Thank you to all 101 parents who responded to the National School Survey. This is a record number of responses. This information is reported in the annual School Report. Due to the high number of respondents I thought I would share your positive feed back and ways that you influence future planning.


There are a number of ways that parents and carers can support children after a traumatic event. Your reaction to an event will


